

Information on the Consortium for Ph.D. Students in Political Science

July 1, 2004

Ph.D. students at The Graduate Center (*not* M.A.) are eligible to take courses in other institutions in the New York City Doctoral Consortium. Those other institutions are:

- Columbia
- Fordham
- New School
- New York University
- Teachers College-Columbia

These are the rules:

1-You must be in residence here for at least two semesters before you can take courses outside. You will continue to pay tuition here at The Graduate Center.

2-Find the course you want to take at the other school. The idea is that this course is not offered at The Graduate Center at all or won't be offered for a few semesters. You can call up the various Political Science Departments yourself.

3-You must get a special (yellow) form from the Registrar's office, Room 7201. On it you need the number and name of the course at the home school/the number and name of the course at the host school as well as the first and last name of the professor at the host school teaching the course. The form must be signed by the Executive Officer and the Vice President For Student Affairs, Mr. Matthew Schoengood (Room 7301) at The Graduate Center plus the Professor and Dean at the host college. The contact information for the host school Deans is on the above-mentioned yellow forms. You should have all these signatures compiled no later than the end of the third week of the CUNY semester.
